

# Pleasanton man killed in Bourbon County rollover

- A Pleasanton man was killed and another injured in a car wreck that occurred just south of the Bourbon County line in the early hours of Sunday, Dec. 14.

21-year-old Matthew D. Croan was killed when the 1999 Dodge Dakota pickup he was driving northbound on 215<sup>th</sup> Street near the junction of Yellowstone Road exited the roadway and entered the east ditch. Authorities say the vehicle rolled several times and Croan was ejected along with his passenger, Michael D. Braim, Jr., age 24.

Croan was pronounced dead at the scene and Braim

was transported to Overland Park Regional Medical Center for treatment of injuries.
